SAT's Week Timetable

The tests must be scheduled on the timetabled day:

Monday 13th May	English grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS) papers 1 (questions) and 2 (spelling)
Tuesday 14th May	English reading paper
Wednesday 15th May	Mathematics papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)
Thursday 16th May	Mathematics paper 3 (reasoning)

What can you do to prepare your child?

- ✓ Revision help your child to revise & practise skills.
- ✓ Daily reading and discussion about their books.
- ✓ Learn & practise spellings.
- ✓ Learn & practise times tables (forwards and backwards).
- ✓ Ensure your child completes their homework.

The Results- At the end of the year you will receive SAT's results for reading, GPS and Maths (including the pupil's scaled score and whether or not they have met the expected standard; and the teachers assessment in writing and science. These normally arrive in July and will be sent out with the end of year reports.

Please remember that SAT's are just a snap-shot of your child, from one hour in their whole time at Our Lady's-they may not always be a true reflection of what your child can do and do not show the WHOLE CHILD. Let's focus on HOW they learn and how far they have come-not a result.
